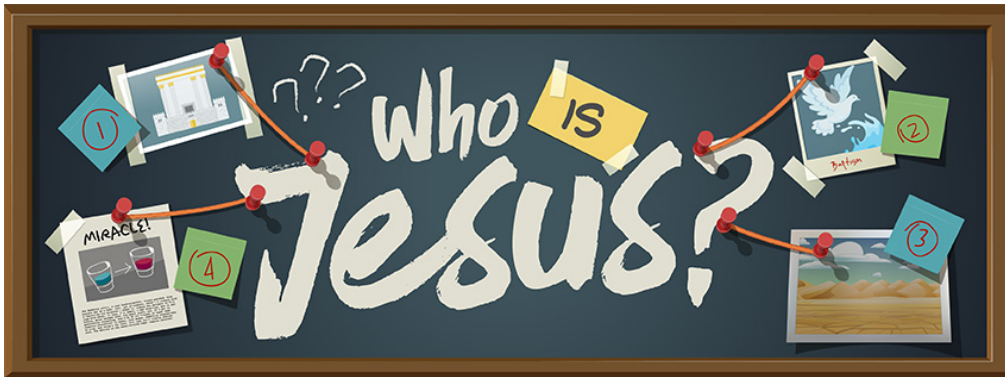

FOR LEADERS

A MESSAGE FOR CHILDREN'S LEADERS

We invite you to pause, listen, and shift your gaze toward the Father...

Dear Sunday School Teachers,

Have you ever wondered why leaves change color in the fall? As the days grow shorter, trees slow down their chlorophyll production, which is the pigment that gives leaves their green color. When the green fades, the vibrant oranges, reds, and purples, which were always there, finally emerge in their full beauty. It's like the leaves' true colors are being revealed.

As you read [John 2:1-11](#), keep this image in mind. Just as the colors of the leaves were always present but hidden, everything about Jesus—His glory, majesty, and power—was always there, waiting for the perfect moment to be revealed.

Imagine being Mary, holding onto memories of angel visits and promises of Jesus' birth, watching and waiting for those promises to come true. Or picture being one of Jesus' disciples, witnessing His first miracle. Jesus may have looked ordinary on the outside, as [Isaiah 53:2](#) tells us, but in this moment, He showed His power over creation and revealed His true glory.

At the wedding, the other guests enjoyed the wine without knowing its miraculous source, but "his disciples believed in him" ([John 2:11](#)). Jesus is still revealing His glory today, in ways we may not always notice. Let's open our eyes to see His work around us, and as we teach the children in our care, let's help them not just appreciate the blessings they receive but recognize and praise the One who gives them

A ROAD MAP

WHO?

Jesus attended a wedding with His disciples. The wedding host was likely a friend of Jesus' family, since Jesus' mother was there. The person in charge of the dinner was not the host but oversaw the celebration.



WHAT?

During the wedding celebration, Jesus' mother came up to Him because the wine ran out. Jesus told some servants to fill stone jars with water, then dip some out for the person in charge. Jesus turned the water into wine, revealing that He is amazing.



WHERE?

The wedding was in Cana in the region of Galilee, north of Judea. Cana may refer to Kefar Kanna, about three miles from Nazareth, or Khirbet Kana, about eight miles from Nazareth. Jesus grew up in Nazareth, so His family likely had friends in Cana.



WHEN?

Jesus turned water into wine early in His ministry. John calls it "the first of [Jesus'] signs" ([John 2:11](#)). Jesus had recently been baptized in the Jordan River, then tempted in the Judean desert.



CONNECTING TO GOD'S BIG STORY

Jesus' first sign of turning water into wine officially put Him on a trajectory that would lead to the cross. There, Jesus would again provide the figurative wine, pouring out His blood for the forgiveness of sins ([Matthew 26:28](#)).

WELCOME QUESTION

SUPPLIES: paper, colored pencils, whiteboard (optional), dry-erase marker (optional), **Water to Wine Welcome Question Slide**

Before kids arrive, display the **Water to Wine Welcome Question Slide**, or write the following question on a whiteboard: "What is your idea of the most amazing party? Describe it!" Set out sheets of paper and coloring utensils.

As kids arrive, warmly welcome them by name and ask them to Check In.

All Ages

Always begin your class with a warm welcome and a social-emotional "check-in". Use the feelings chart and ask each child how they are feeling (refrain from asking "How are you?" as children may be accustomed to responding with "fine"). You may want to print and post the feelings chart in your classroom for ease of use.

- Allow each child to name their feeling or to use a color to name their feeling. Older children might use words, younger children might point to the pictures or use the colors to express their feelings.
- There are no wrong feelings and all feelings should be acknowledged.
- Acknowledge how children feel by giving each child time and space to share anything they might need or want to share in regard to their feelings. For example, you can ask "Why are you angry?" or "What made you sad?"
- If you can, address the feeling (hunger/thirst - provide a snack/drink, sadness - give a hug, joy - give a high five, tired - let the child rest, anger - a calming space, etc.).
- Keep in mind throughout the lesson how each child is feeling and that feelings may change during your time with the child.
- If you notice a change, you may want to allow the child to rename their feeling and again address the feeling if needed.
- Acknowledge all feelings, concerns, joys, and celebrations in your opening and closing prayer. Use a grace-based approach to the learning as feelings will impact how children learn. (adapted from the Zones of Regulation)

Show them the **Welcome Question** and invite them to share their answers with a couple of other kids. If you have younger kids, make sure to read the question for them. You may want to help kids start imagining a great party by offering some ideas: Where would this party be? What would the guests do? What would they eat and drink? Invite kids who love drawing to create illustrations of their ideal party.

At your start time...

As you get started, welcome everyone and let them know you're so glad they came to church today. Call on several kids to share their answers to the Welcome Question: *What is your idea of the most amazing party? Describe it!*

These parties sound wonderful! Today we're going to learn about how Jesus went to a wedding—a big party—and did something that revealed how amazing He is. But, first, it's time to be curious.

INTERACTIVE GAME: REVEAL THAT ITEM

SUPPLIES: medium-sized boxes (5), stuffed animal, piece of fruit, doll, Bible, mitten, permanent marker (prep only), tape (prep only), table, **Reveal that Item Slide**, **Water to Wine Wonder Truth Slide**

Ahead of time, place each of these items in a box (one item per box): stuffed animal, piece of fruit, doll, Bible, mitten. (You may use the items listed or any simple items you have on hand!) Number the outside of the boxes 1–5. Close each box and secure it with a loose piece of tape. (Kids will need to open the boxes easily.) Set the boxes in the front of your classroom area with the numbers facing the audience. Place a table at the front of your classroom.

Gather kids and display the **Reveal that Item Slide**. **Today we're going to learn about something unusual Jesus did to reveal, or show, how amazing He is: He turned water into wine! This is the first of Jesus' recorded miracles. A miracle is a good and surprising event that can't be explained. This was the first time Jesus' disciples started to see how amazing Jesus really is. Let's play a fun game where we work to reveal different items!**

Invite a volunteer to come up front. Ask him to choose one of the boxes, numbered 1–5, and set it on the table. Next he can open it carefully and look inside. He should not touch the item or say anything about what it is. The other kids will try guessing what is in the box by asking him yes/no questions about the object. You might need to get them started with a few suggestions of things to ask, such as, "Is it a toy?" "Is it soft?" "Is it something we can read?"

You can add an element of challenge by giving kids a time limit to guess what is in the box. Play the Who Is Jesus? Set a timer for 30 seconds to create a sense of urgency as kids guess what is in the box.

Make It Inclusive: Kids with processing challenges as well as younger kids can struggle to think of yes/no questions to ask. Partner kids up, pairing older kids with younger and kids who are verbally acute with those who process more slowly. Give pairs time to brainstorm questions together before anyone shares their questions with the larger group.

Allergy Caution:

This activity contains possible food allergens!

Teaching Tips:

For Older Kids: When Jesus turned water to wine, the Bible tells us He "revealed his glory" ([John 2:11](#)). Introduce the word *glory* to the older kids in your group, explaining that "God's glory" refers to His majesty, abundance, and amazingness. Then use the word *glory* throughout the lesson as you talk about Jesus being amazing!

Kids can continue taking turns asking their yes/no questions until they correctly guess what is in the box. Then the kid up front can reveal the object to everyone. Play multiple rounds with different kids volunteering each time.

Display the **Water to Wine Wonder Truth Slide**. It was so fun working to reveal the items in the box! Jesus revealed how amazing He is to His disciples when He did a miracle at a wedding. I'm excited to learn about it with you as we discover today's Wonder Truth: **JESUS REVEALS THAT HE IS AMAZING.**

DECLARING GOD'S WONDER

Display the **Water to Wine Declaration Slide**. Read each line boldly and invite kids to repeat after you.

Thank You, God, that You are good! (Kids repeat.)

You made me on purpose, for a purpose. (Kids repeat.)

And I am Your kid! (Kids repeat.)

You know me, love me, and lead me. (Kids repeat.)

You do wonderful things; (Kids repeat.)

Thank You for showing me that You are amazing! (Kids repeat.)

My life can tell of Your wonder! (Kids repeat.)

OPENING PRAYER

Before entering into God’s big story, lead kids in an opening prayer. Use the prayer here or your own words: **Father, we thank You that we have this time together to learn more about who You are and how we can live as Your kids! We ask Your Holy Spirit to guide us today as we spend time with You. Thank You for sending Your Son, Jesus, who did miracles that revealed how amazing He is! In Jesus’ name, Amen.**

GOD’S BIG STORY

This lesson includes three opportunities for your kids to enter the story – we recommend you choose **HEAR IT!** or **EXPERIENCE IT!** and supplement with the **WATCH IT!** video. **HEAR IT!** is read directly from the Bible. **EXPERIENCE IT!** is an interactive story-telling activity.

Hear It!

SUPPLIES: Bibles (1 per kid)

Display the **Water to Wine Title Slide**. Encourage the kids to open their Bibles to [John 2](#). Explain that John is one of the four Gospels: Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John. The Gospels are books at the beginning of the New Testament that tell us about the life of Jesus.

Let’s start by reading part of God’s big story directly from the Bible. Afterward, we will watch and experience more of the story! Invite three volunteers to help read the Bible passage from [John 2:1–12](#). The first volunteer can read [John 2:1–3](#), the second can read [John 2:4–7](#), and the third can read [John 2:8–12](#).

Experience It!

SUPPLIES: flat bed sheets or tablecloths (2–3), table, clear shatter-proof jars (6), water, food coloring drops (red, yellow, and blue), wooden spoon, grape or cherry drink mix powder, opaque jars or cups (6), water pitcher, goblets (several), Bible, juice pouches or juice boxes (1 per kid, optional)

Ahead of time, cover a table with flat bed sheets or tablecloths so they drape to the floor on the side that will face the audience. Fill three of the clear jars to the brim with water. Mix one color of food coloring into each jar: red, yellow, blue. Set the three empty clear jars next to the three full ones, along with the wooden spoon. Pour drink mix powder into the six opaque jars or cups and fill the water pitcher with water. Place the six opaque jars or cups, water pitcher, and goblets on the floor under the table (hidden from the audience).

Hey, friends! I have a little science experiment challenge for you. We've got red, yellow, and blue water up here. Can anyone make some orange water? Select a kid volunteer and watch her make orange water in an empty jar by mixing some of the red water with some of the yellow water. (If the volunteer isn't sure how to make orange water, whisper instructions to her.) Encourage her to only fill up the jar about a quarter of the way. Thank the volunteer and invite her to return to her seat.

Can anyone make some green water? How about purple? Select two more volunteers to mix colors. One will make green water by mixing yellow and blue water. One will make purple water by mixing blue and red water. (If they aren't sure how to make their assigned colors, quietly give them instructions.) Thank the volunteers and invite them to return to their seats.

Look at all these colors! We started with three and now we have a rainbow! I wonder if anything else changed. What flavor water do you think this could be? Hold up a jar and take answers. Ask for opinions on the two other mixed colors. **Let's test and see if we changed these jars of water into orange juice, limeade, or grape juice!** Sip from one of the jars (or ask a willing adult leader to do so), confirming that while the color has changed, the liquid indeed remains simple water.

(Thinking) **What would you do to change the liquid in these jars into something completely different, like grape juice or cherry drink?** Take answers. **It's impossible for us to do without any other ingredients! But not for Jesus. Let's check out today's part of God's big story.**

Open the Bible to [John 2](#) and hold it or set it next to you as you continue. **When Jesus grew up, He was strong and wise and pleasing to God. At His baptism, God's voice declared that Jesus is God's Son. Then the Holy Spirit led Jesus into the desert, where He was tempted by the devil. Did Jesus sin?**

Kids respond. **The world had never known a person like Jesus. He was the Messiah—the One who would bring about God's kingdom.**

As you continue, slowly clear the work table by placing the clear jars under the table. **After He left the desert, Jesus went to Galilee where He had grown up. Along the way, some people started following Jesus as His disciples. They were His students.**

Set goblets around the table. **One day, Jesus and His disciples were invited to a wedding in the town of Cana. At that time, wedding celebrations lasted seven days! There was food and drink and plenty of laughter. It was a joyous time. Unless they ran out of food ... or drink.**

Jesus' mom was at this wedding too. She came up to Jesus because she had heard of some bad news. Pick up a goblet, look inside, then hold it upside down. **The wine had run out! How embarrassing! People were going to remember this for years.**

Allergy Caution:

This activity contains possible food allergens! Due to possible food sensitivities and allergies, invite adult leaders, rather than kids, to test the water and drink mix that are part of the Bible storytelling.

ELEMENTARY

Step in front of the table and address the kids directly. **If you had been at the wedding, what would you have done to help solve the problem of no more wine?** Take a few answers, acknowledging the fact that it would have been impossible to correct this mistake. **There were no stores, no online shopping, no grocery-store delivery services, and no vineyard nearby.**

The party would have been over, and everyone would remember this wedding as a big embarrassment.

Wedding guests usually brought gifts to help cover the cost of the wedding. When the wine ran out, Jesus' mother wanted Jesus to give an extra special gift. She said to him, "They have no more wine" ([John 2:3](#)). Ah! Smart move, Mary! She asked Jesus to help. But what could Jesus do about that?

Jesus loved His mom. "Dear woman," He replied, "Why are you telling me about this? The time for me to show who I really am isn't here yet" ([John 2:4](#)). After all, Jesus' ministry was just beginning. Not even His disciples could guess where it would lead Him. They didn't realize yet that Jesus would perform many signs and miracles along the way. Jesus' mom spoke to the servants: "Do what he tells you" ([John 2:5](#)).

Step behind the table and slowly place the six opaque jars or cups and the pitcher of water in the center of the table as you continue. **There were six stone water jars nearby. They were huge, much bigger than these—big enough to hold 20–30 gallons. They were typically used for special religious washings, but today Jesus had something else in mind. Jesus said to the servants, "Fill the jars with water" ([John 2:7](#)). What?! It's the middle of a crisis! Why would Jesus waste the servants' time by having them fill all these jars with water? How would that fix the problem?**

Step in front of the table and directly address the kids. **What would you do? Would you have listened to Jesus and filled the jars? Or would you have asked the people in charge of the wedding for their own instructions?** Allow a few answers.

The Bible says the servants did exactly as Jesus had asked. Step behind the table and pour water from the pitcher into the six opaque jars or cups. **The servants filled the jars to the top with water. Then he told them, "Now dip some out. Take it to the person in charge of the dinner" ([John 2:8](#)).**

The person in charge was responsible for making sure everyone was having a good time. If these servants gave him a goblet of water, he would have been angry and insulted! What would you have done? Obeyed Jesus or found a different job to do at the wedding? Allow a few answers.

Fortunately, the servants obeyed Jesus. They filled a goblet with liquid from the jars. If needed, mix the liquid in the opaque jar or cup with the wooden spoon, then pour the grape or cherry drink from an opaque jar or cup into a goblet. **Then the servants brought it to the person in charge.** Bring the goblet out into the audience. Ask a willing adult leader to taste the drink. **When he tasted what the servants brought him, it didn't taste like water, because it wasn't water. Not anymore. Jesus had turned the water into wine! What did your drink taste like?** Allow volunteer to answer.

The person in charge had no idea where the wine came from. He called the groom aside because the wine was so good. "Everyone brings out the best wine first. But you have saved the best until now" ([John 2:10](#)). Jesus had saved the day! Not everyone knew what had happened, but the servants knew. And Jesus' disciples knew and believed in Jesus.

What Jesus did at the wedding in Cana—saving the host from embarrassment by turning water into wine—was the first of Jesus' signs. It revealed how amazing Jesus is, and it showed how generously He gives. This wouldn't be the last gift Jesus gave. Just as He provided the best wine, He would one day provide the best sacrifice and make the way for a celebration in God's kingdom that will never end. Through all His signs and miracles, Jesus reveals that He is amazing.

I secretly added a drink mix powder to the cups that changed the water into a tasty drink. Jesus did not add anything to the water. He simply, through His power, changed the water into wine, which is why this was such an amazing miracle.

Consider offering juice pouches or boxes to the kids to celebrate when Jesus turned water to wine at Cana. Just be aware of kids' food allergies and sensitivities!

CONNECTING THE WONDER TRUTH

Display the **Water to Wine Wonder Truth Slide**. Pose the following question to kids to help them connect the Wonder Truth to God's big story:

Our Wonder Truth today is JESUS REVEALS THAT HE IS AMAZING. Where did you see our Wonder Truth in the story? Allow kids to answer freely.

Before Jesus died for us, He compared His blood to wine. His blood was poured out on the cross for the forgiveness of sins ([Matthew 26:28](#)). Because of Jesus' death and resurrection, the wrong things we do can be forgiven, and we can have a relationship with God forever!

ELEMENTARY

Divide your group into smaller groups based on age. If your group is already small, stay together for this time.

QUESTIONS: YOUNGER KIDS

- Why did Jesus go to the town of Cana?
- What happened at the wedding that was bad news for the people there?
- What did Jesus do about the wine running out?
- What do you think the servants were thinking when Jesus asked them to fill the big jars with water?
- Jesus turned water into wine! What does this show us about Him?
- When has Jesus done something amazing in your life?

Turning water to wine was the first of Jesus' miracles that the Bible tells us about. That day, Jesus revealed He is amazing! Let's take some time to thank Jesus for the amazing things He does and for who He is!

PRAYER TIME: YOUNGER KIDS

Invite kids to share something they are thankful for from the past week or something amazing Jesus has done in their lives. Then spend some time praying, thanking Jesus for who He is and for how He reveals how amazing He is to each of you.

QUESTIONS: OLDER KIDS

- Why did Jesus and His disciples—His followers—go to the town of Cana?
- How many days did weddings last during Bible times?
- What unfortunate thing happened at the wedding? What did Jesus do about it?
- What does this miracle show us about Jesus?
- Jesus chose to do this miracle at a wedding, which was a time of great joy and celebration. What do you think this might show us about Jesus?
- When was a time you saw Jesus do something amazing in your life?

Jesus' first recorded miracle was an amazing gift to the guests of the wedding. Jesus showed His followers more about who He is by doing something wonderful that blessed others. Let's take some time to pray for each other and thank Jesus for being amazing.

PRAYER TIME: OLDER KIDS

Invite kids to share prayer requests or praises. Encourage those who are willing to pray for some of the requests aloud. End the prayer time by thanking Jesus for revealing His glory and for the amazing things He does.

Part of this story reminds me of the Fourth Commandment. Let's say it together, "Honor your father and your mother, that your days may be long upon the land which the Lord your God is giving you." Would anyone like to say it by themselves? Only if kids freely offer to recite the commandment, allow them to do so. Don't pressure kids to recite the commandments. **Jesus was a good Son. His mother asked Him to help solve a problem at the wedding, the host had run out of wine, and He obeyed and helped, even though He did not want to reveal who He was. Do your parents ever ask you to do things you don't want to do?** Allow kids to answer. **What are some things they want you to do, but you don't want to do them?** Allow kids to share their answers. **I didn't want to do those things either, but the Fourth Commandment tells us we should honor our parents by being obedient. That is what is pleasing to God.**

Teaching Tips:

For Older Kids:
When Jesus turned water to wine, the Bible tells us He "revealed his glory" ([John 2:11](#)). As kids discuss the amazing things Jesus does, ask them if they know what the word glory means. If needed, explain that "God's glory" refers to His majesty, abundance, and amazingness.

RESPONDING IN WORSHIP: GOD IS AMAZING!

SUPPLIES: paper (1 sheet per kid), coloring utensils, [Responding in Worship Slide](#), [God Is Amazing Slides](#) or [Sheets](#), [Who Is Jesus? Elementary Spotify playlist](#)

Ahead of time, prepare to display the [God Is Amazing Slides](#), or print the [God Is Amazing Sheets](#).

Gather the kids together. Display the [Responding in Worship Slide](#). Jesus did an incredible miracle by turning water into wine. He revealed to His followers that He is amazing, and they began to realize that He is more than just a man. Jesus isn't here with us in the same way He was when He lived and walked on earth, but He is still with us through the Holy Spirit. And we see God's amazingness all around us all the time!

One by one, show the kids the [God Is Amazing Slides](#) (1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6) or [Sheets](#). Pause on each one, inviting the kids to look closely and notice amazing things in each one. Consider asking them the following questions:

- What do you notice in this photo?
- What is amazing about what you see?
- What does this image reveal, or show us, about God?

Take time to reflect on each image and allow the kids to share their thoughts. Share your own reflections as well.

We worship a wonderful God, and He does wonderful things each and every day. We can see His amazingness revealed in creation and in our family and friends. We read in the Bible about the amazing things He has done. God's amazingness is all around us!

Give kids a chance to reflect on where they've seen God's amazing works in their own lives. Hand out blank sheets of paper and coloring utensils, and invite kids to draw something that represents what God's amazingness looks like to them. They may want to draw something abstract or something concrete from their lives. Allow them to draw whatever the Holy Spirit puts on their hearts. Consider playing music from the [Who Is Jesus? Elementary Spotify playlist](#) while kids draw.

Make It Inclusive: *If you have kids who are vision impaired, invite other kids to describe the images aloud. Encourage kids to share the sounds that might go along with the images—a crying baby, a marching ant, grandma's laugh, a whale's splash, etc.*

Teaching Tips:

For Younger Kids:

You may want to help younger kids think through this activity by giving them some suggestions. Maybe they've noticed God's amazing work in their garden at home or when they go on a walk. Maybe they've felt His amazing love through the love they feel from a family member or when they listen to a song about Jesus.
